**THE RESURRECTION HAS  
IMPACTED THE PAST.**

■ IT SETS JESUS APART FROM ALL OTHERS.

■ IT CHANGED HISTORY.

- ☞ He touched time itself.

**THE RESURRECTION CHANGES  
THE PRESENT.**

■ IT VALIDATES & CONFIRMS OUR FAITH.

- ☞ Because Jesus did rise from the dead, our faith is verified!
- ☞ Many of the great shakers and movers in history were considered crazy by their peers until they substantiated their claims. 📖 **Matthew 27:40-42**

- ☞ Finally, the disciples found the answer to their sins in the death of Jesus and the answer to their deaths in His resurrection.

■ IT ACTIVATES & EMPOWERS OUR FAITH.

- ☞ Jesus' presence with them, even after His ascension, empowered them to share this life-changing message.
- ☞ The secret of success in the Christian life is not imitation its inhabitation.

■ THAT'S GOOD NEWS BECAUSE DEATH IS INEVITABLE. 📖 Ecclesiastes 8:8

■ THE RESURRECTION MEANS JESUS DEFEATED DEATH.

- ☞ It takes away fear. 📖 Hebrews 2:14-15
- ☞ Jesus has changed the meaning of death.

📖 Revelation 21:4

- ⇒ What had Peter's readers done even though they had not seen Jesus? (1:8)
- ⇒ What did Peter say was the goal of faith? (1:9)
- ⇒ About what did the prophets speak and for what did they search? (1:10-12)
- ⇒ What did the angels long to do? (1:12)
